

Get Active: Let them know you care!



Here are 3 simple things **YOU** can do right now for the Queensland's Environment:

- **Write to Campbell Newman and the Liberal National Party** reminding them of Queensland's TOP 5 environmental priorities (see below) and urging them to adopt policies to give strong ongoing protection for our environment.

- **Contact your local MP and the main candidates in your Electorate** (focus on Liberal National Party, Labor and the Greens) and tell them why the environment is of great importance to you and remind them of the TOP 5 environmental priorities for Queensland.

You can write, phone or go visit your local candidates (see our "Meet in Person with your Candidates" Sheet with tips about doing this. Contact our office on 3846 1420 if you would prefer someone to accompany you at a meeting).

- **Contact the media about the importance of Queensland's environment.** Your local newspaper and the Courier Mail may publish your Letters to the Editor or comments through their website. Your letters and comments will be noticed by political candidates as they canvass the issues of concern to people they intend to represent.

REMEMBER: you can also ask five of your friends to do these activities too. That way, Campbell Newman and other local candidates get a strong message that many Queenslanders want the environment protected.
