



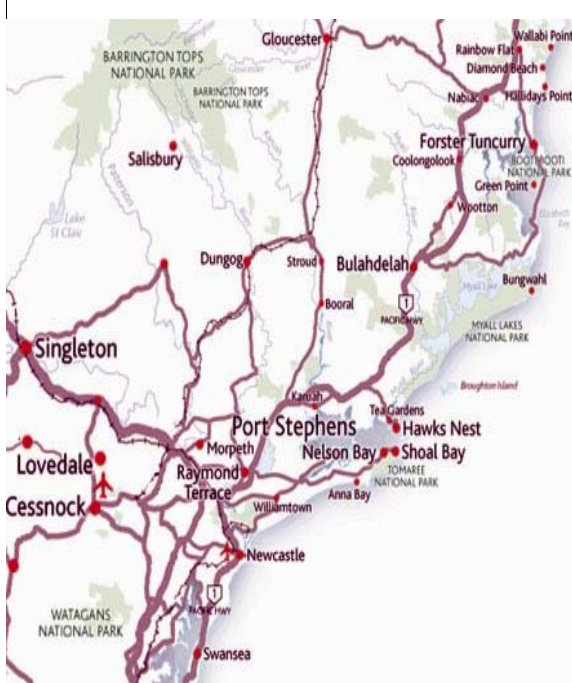
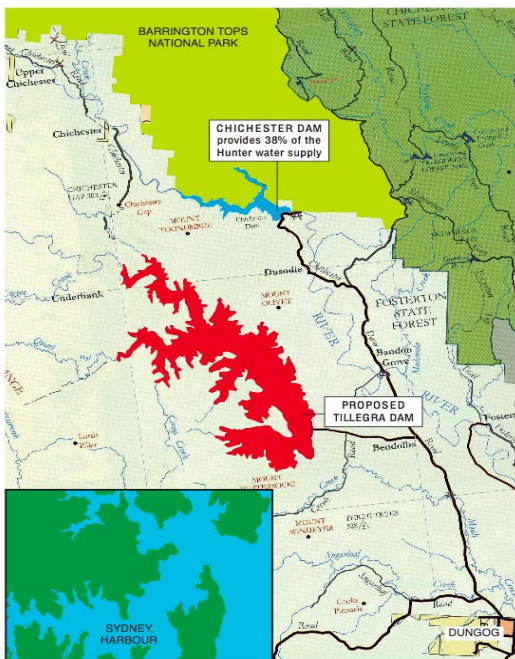
The Williams River urgently needs your help.

You have an opportunity to protect this river and its inhabitants.

In November 2006 the NSW government announced the construction of the \$450 million dollar Tillegra Dam. The proposed dam is costly, unnecessary and environmentally destructive. Due to the geological nature of the area, construction costs will potentially blow out to one billion dollars.

Please take 5 minutes to write a letter calling on the NSW government to put a stop to this unnecessary and costly dam. This is your opportunity to support the protection of the Williams River and its' inhabitants.

<u>VITAL STATISTICS</u>	<u>WHAT THIS REALLY MEANS</u>
450GL or 450B Litres storage capacity	Approximate size of Sydney Harbour
80 metre high wall	Approximately the size of a 25 storey office building
700 metre length wall	Approximately 7 football fields long
3,500 hectares total effected area	The equivalent of 5147 football fields
Prime farmland to be inundated = 2,000 hectares	Loss of prime agricultural land
Estimated storage to be full by 2020	Unpredictable rainfall due to climate change - will it ever fill?
Estimated cost = \$400 million	Cost blow out predicted due to geological instability in area
Farming families dislocated = 90	Loss of prime agricultural land, social & community disintegration
Economic losses in Dungog = \$10 million per annum	Loss of working farms, jobs & business income

Writing a letter is easy. You do not need to be an expert; you simply need to care about protecting our environment and keeping the cost of living in the Hunter from rising further.

Below is a sample letter suggesting key points to make.

I am writing to strongly support protection of the Williams River and surrounding valley for future generations.

Please make the following points in your letter:

Dam Unnecessary

- *we have more water than we can use in the Hunter Valley*
- *the Central Coast does not want or need our water*
- *demand management and water conservation initiatives are proven alternatives*

Dam Expensive

- *Hunter Water customers – about 500,000 of us – will pay for the construction of the Tillegra Dam*
- *This dam could cost Hunter Water rate payers an extra \$450 per year with anticipated cost blowouts.*

Dam Destructive

- *Rivers are one of our most precious assets, the Williams is one of the last decent rivers in the region.*
- *Destroying rivers is a short-sighted investment strategy*
- *The Williams River is home to the iconic platypus, Australian Bass and a variety of other fish and mussel species, damming the river would be detrimental to the health of these animals.*

It's great to add why you think the Williams River is important. If you have a personal connection with the river and the area then it is a great idea to mention it (eg. you grew up near it, live there now or sometimes visit for holidays).
